Elective courses - chosen by the student

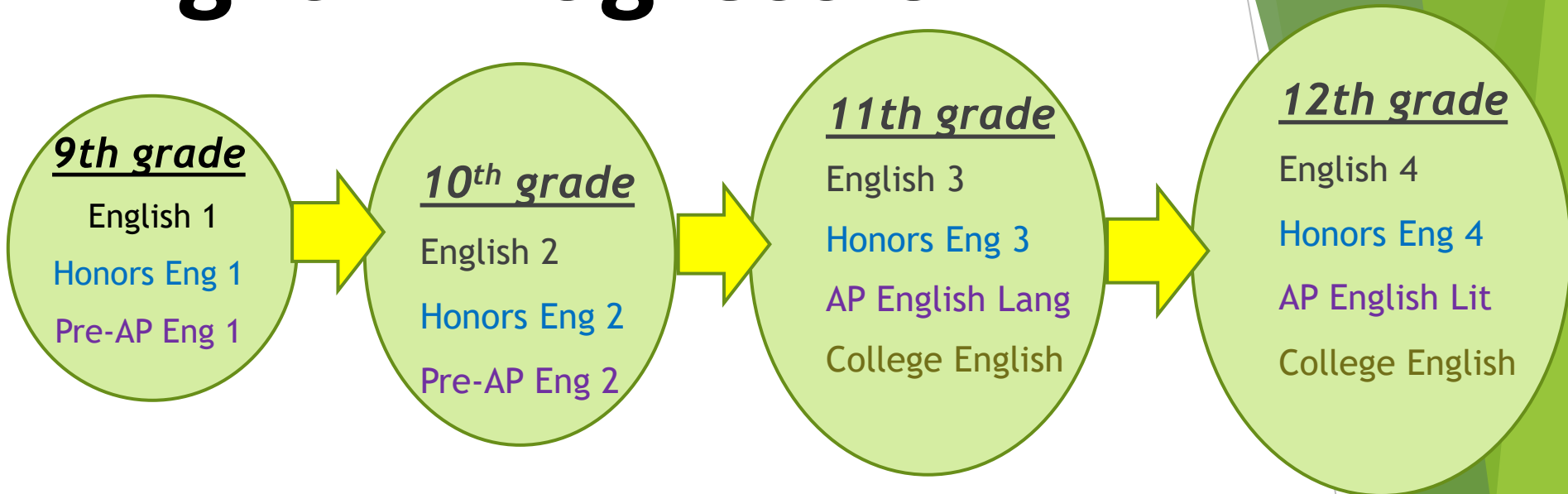

Assigned based on:

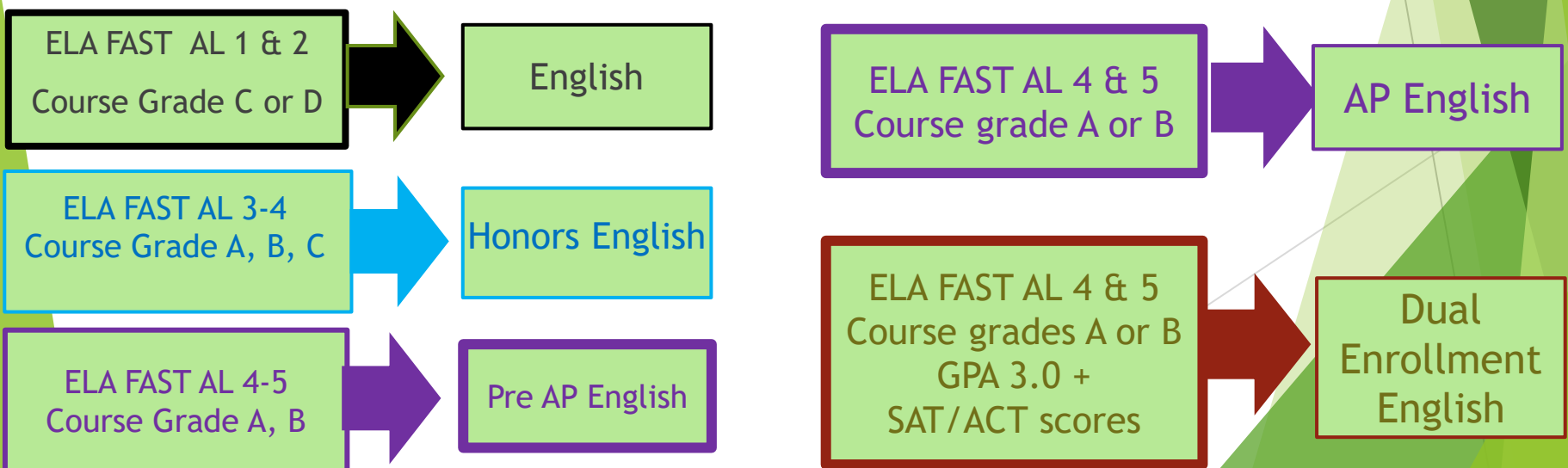
- ▶ Academic history / previous courses

The following course progressions are subject to change based on professional district guidance

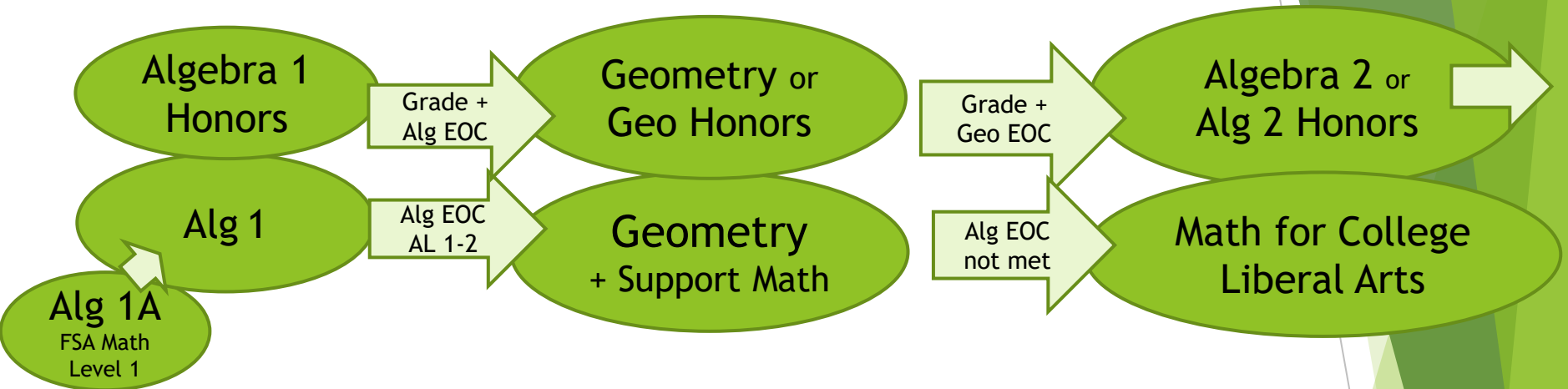
English Progression

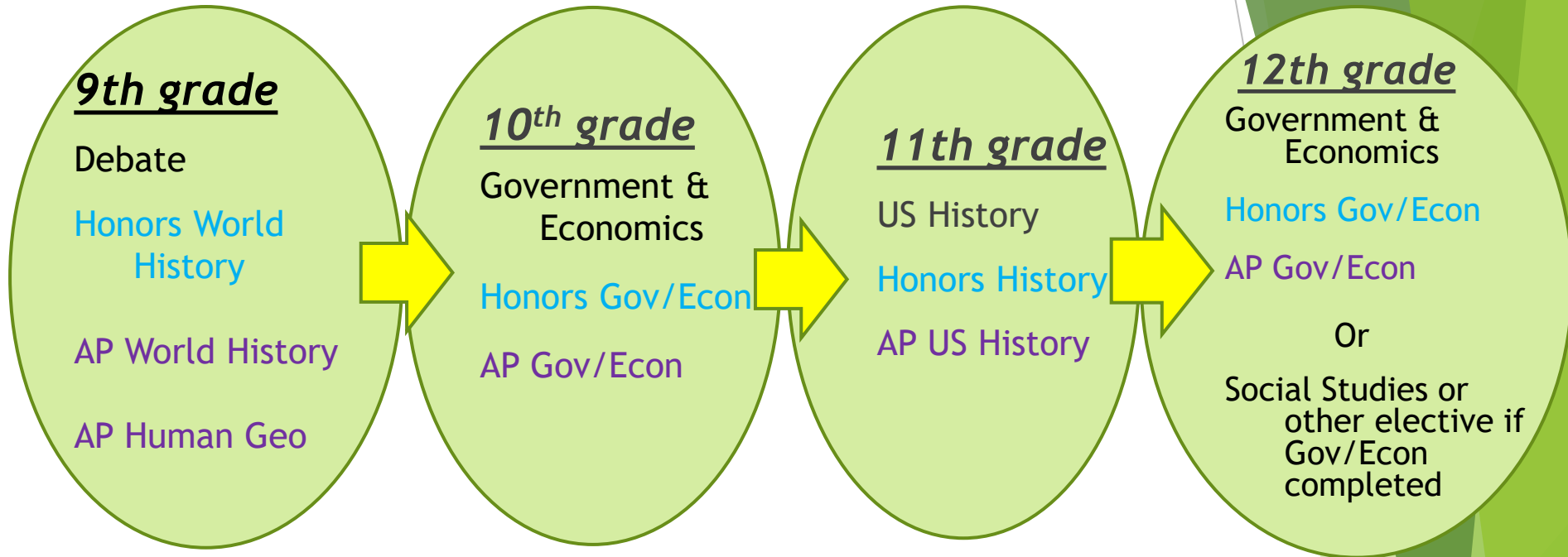

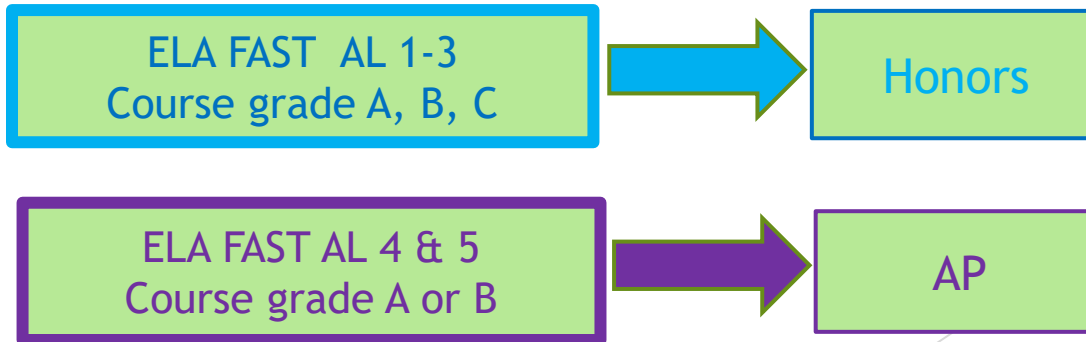

- Dual Enrollment Intermediate Algebra & College Algebra

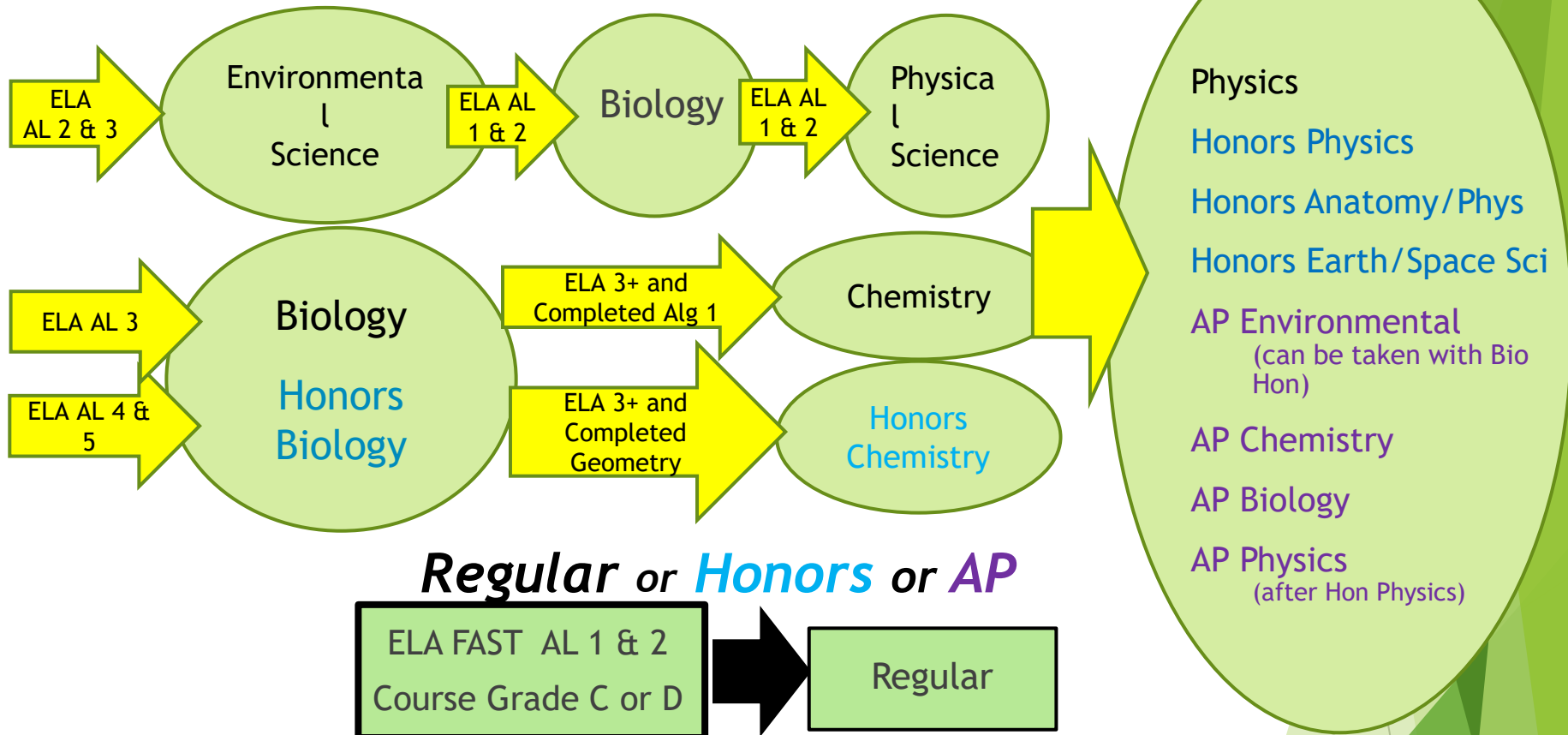

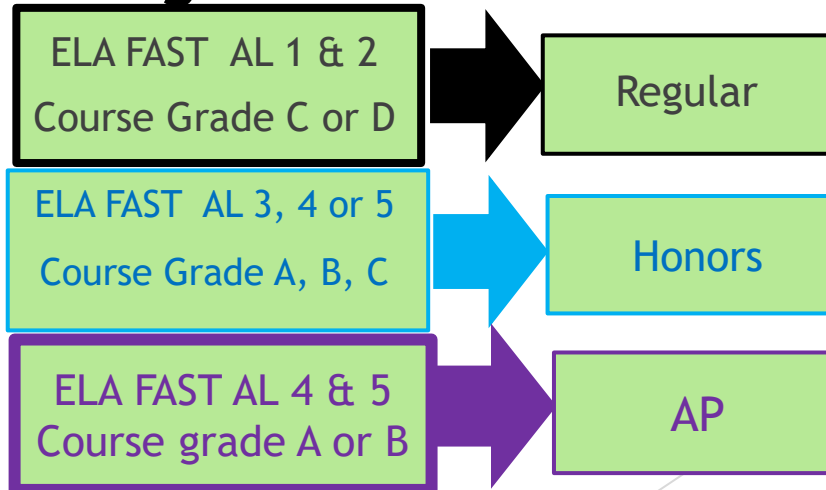

Online Registration Form

Registration for electives will be completed using the online registration form - Feb 21st to Feb 27th

- ▶ Students will need their school email address to enter on the form
- ▶ Academy or top choice elective should be entered as #1 choice
- ▶ Select a total of 6 elective choices in priority order
- ▶ Consider graduation requirements (fine arts, HOPE)
- ▶ Remember academic rigor required for college (including Foreign Language)
- ▶ Students will receive an auto reply to the school email address provided confirming their elective choices

Example of online registration form through Google Docs

- Students enter their name
- Student ID # with the 5300
- Be sure to use the student email address
- Parent email is requested, but optional (email confirmation is only sent to student email address)

ELECTIVE Courses are chosen by the student and guardian. Please select the #1 choice/ACADEMY Choice below and then select 5 additional electives. The #1 choice is prioritized in scheduling. Then, #2 choice is prioritized, then #3. If the #2 or 3 choices are unable to be scheduled, students will be scheduled into their #4, 5 or 6 choices. It's important to choose wisely as materials are ordered and teachers are hired based on course selection, therefore changing courses is not an option once schedules are completed in the summer.

ACADEMIC Courses are determined by course history, state testing data and the Polk County course progression plans. The comments/request box at the end can provide input on these academics.

Students will receive a confirmation email at the student school email address provided with elective course selected. The most recent submission will be used for scheduling elective courses. Access to the electric form closes on Feb 18th. Students may update/resubmit their elective choices through this date.

- Counselors will do their best to give students their top electives but may need to move on to a student's 4th, 5th, or 6th choice based on course availability or how the courses fit in their schedule
- Choose carefully!! Materials are ordered and teachers are hired based on these course selections.
- Schedule changes are EXTREMELY limited when the student chose the course on their registration form

Student Input

- Comments box should be used for input on selected classes or academic classes. Examples may be:
 - I would prefer Dual Enrollment English instead of AP English
 - I'm taking HOPE online for my PE credit
 - I prefer to take AP Statistics instead of AP Calculus
- Appropriate comments will be considered when scheduling, but all requests may not be able to be honored

Academic courses will be determined based on 1-Academic History 2-Course Progression 3- Test Data and 4-Teacher Input.

Each student will received a printed copy of his/her course request to verify in May. Any updates or changes need to be submitted with a parent signature to Student Services by May 27th.

Things to consider when choosing elective courses: **Graduation Requirements**

Required Credits

- 4 English
- 4 Math -Must include Alg 1 & Geometry
- 3 Science -Must include Biology
- 3 Social Studies - World Hist, US History, US Gov & Econ
- 1 Fine/Performing Arts
- 1 Physical Education – Must include Personal Fitness or HOPE
- 8 Electives
- One online credit

Academic courses are assigned, but the **Fine Arts, Physical Education, and Electives can be chosen by the student.**

- **Fine Arts** – visual arts, performing arts, design & technology courses, Digital information technology, Horticulture, Engineering & Architecture, or 2 yrs of JROTC
- **Physical Education** – HOPE can be taken on campus or through FLVS and counts for the online requirement, Personal Fitness is offered through FLVS, or 2 yr of JROTC counts for the physical education requirement

Things to consider when choosing elective courses:

Elective courses should align with post-secondary plans and allow career exploration

Planning to go straight to a 4 year college? Elective courses should add rigor and include academics, AP, and foreign language along with career preparation.

State College 2+2 plan? Taking dual enrollment courses to complete General Education credits would provide a head start to AA degree requirements.

Career Academies give students experiences in different career fields. Most offer industry certifications that prepare students for direct entry into the workforce and for further education in that field.

Considering military? The JROTC program offers military information along with leadership experiences. It's an opportunity for students to get involved on campus. Colleges also offer ROTC programs with scholarship opportunities at state colleges and universities.

Things to consider when choosing elective courses:


State University System

Core Admission Requirements

- 18 academic units is the minimum requirement - most universities prefer more
- Competitive universities want at least 5 academic courses each year
- What is an academic (core) credit?
 - English
 - Math
 - Science
 - Social Studies
 - Foreign Language (2 yrs min required)
 - AP Course
